

Your Agency Specifics:

1. The PHDL is available at <https://nphco.tdnetdiscover.com> LHA users will be sent to a login page where they can choose the option to 'register here'.

2. The name used in our system for your department: **Colorado Local Health Departments**  
Users will look for this name when creating a user account in the system. (User's email domain(s) will be associated with this name so if user's email does not match exact domain(s) they will not be able to create an account. This is not usually a problem)

3. Your Partner Library is the **UC Health (System) Library**. The PHDL page will automatically route the requesting user to the citation and request form that will be routed to the Partner Library. ILL expenses are part of department's fees and users are not charged for the articles delivered.
4. CLSI The ECLIPSE database of standards and protocols from Clinical Laboratory Standards Institute. It is visible from the PHDL page. This resource has another level of password protection but it is not available to local health departments.

#### SUGGESTED COPY FOR PHDL WEB LANDING PAGE

If there is an intermediary or splash page from the intranet, it would be informative for staff to know these details:

1. Contact information. We suggest including the contact person at the department as well as our general email, [phdl@umassmed.edu](mailto:phdl@umassmed.edu) can be linked to contact us for questions and support issues.
2. Some of descriptive copy (optional):
  - a. Attribution of CDPHE's sponsorship/auspices for the PHDL for Colorado Local Health Departments
  - b. Colorado Local Health Departments participates with other public health departments accessing information resources to support evidence-based practice throughout the state
  - c. The program is managed by the National Public Health Coordination Office as a program of the Network of the National Library of Medicine
3. Partner Library...your partner library is UC Health; you can request an article not in the collection through the Document Delivery feature within the PHDL page or in PubMed; the request will route directly to your Partner Library. Your Partner Library will send your requested articles through your local health department email.

## Document Delivery with the Public Health Digital Library

The PHDL links to your Partner Library's document delivery system. For journals not in the PHDL collection, your Partner Library will receive your article request either from your search in PubMed or the PHDL's Citation Matcher.

If a PDF or HTML of the article does not appear, a pre-filled form will load to let you order the article.

Partner Libraries use either an

- a) **ILL platform** like ILLIAD. You will need to do a one-time registration; the platform manages requests for you
- b) **Email-based request**. For all requests, enter your contact information to request the article using your department email.



# Setting up PubMed for the Check PHDL Button with NCBI


Here's how to set your [NCBI account](#) to find PHDL full-text **Check PHDL** button.

Step 1: Go to PubMed; at upper right-hand corner click **“Log in”** and sign in with your accepted [federated account credentials](#).



Step 2: Hold the cursor over your login name and click on **“Dashboard”** from the pop-up menu.

Step 3: In My NCBI click on the link **“NCBI Site Preferences”** in the upper right corner.



Step 4: Scroll down to the [PubMed Preferences](#) and click on the link for **“Outside Tool”**

Step 5: The new page opens with the A-Z list at the top, click on the letter **“P”** and scroll down to see the listing for the **“Public Health Digital Library NPHCO (Worcester, MA)”**. Click on the radio button to select.

Step 6: Scroll back up to hit the **“Save”** button. That's it. You can continue searching from the MyNCBI screen.

Remember the **Check PHDL** button is in every citation [in Abstract format](#).

Clicking on the button will take you to the article (if in the PHDL) or allow you to request the article through your Partner Library.
