

The Public Health Digital Library (PHDL)

Your department brings you research information (journals, books, databases) through the Public Health Digital Library.

Find the PHDL at your department intranet.

Users in departments not directly linked to the PHDL can create a user account and login anywhere.

Search your topics in PubMed for relevant articles.

Use MyNCBI to find PHDL articles or easily order articles not in the PHDL. Run and save searches, send results to email or your research group.



STAT!Ref is the place for e-books. It provides access to over 75 books, reference tools, databases, IOM and FEMA reports.

You can cross-search through titles like EBMCalc, ICD-10, Merck, Stedman's, epidemiology, nursing, and emergency preparedness titles.



Your easy-to-use mapping tool!

PolicyMap is your new tool for discovery!

With PolicyMap, find and report data on health determinants, outcomes, environment, education, housing and more.



CABI's Global Health is a database of public health research with a global scope; research not indexed in PubMed: journal articles, reports, conference proceedings, book chapters, policy documents.



The Cochrane Library gathers the best evidence for decision-making: consensus-driven systematic reviews. Public health, clinical, and behavioral topics.

At work or through your VPN, your department network is linked to the PHDL


No need to use a login

- At the 'NPHCO Remote Access Self Registration' page, type your First and Last name, **work email** address and select your Public Health Department.

- Watch for an **OpenAthens** email (check your junk folder). In the email, click the activation link.
- You will be taken to a logon page to create your password. Note your username.

How to access full text articles from the PHDL

1. **From the PHDL Page.** If you have details about the article, use the Citation Matcher from the top menu or the bottom of the PHDL Page. You can enter parts of the citation:

- Title
- Author
- Journal
- Year
- DOI or PMID

If the article is in the PHDL, you are taken to the full text in HTML or PDF.

If the article is not in the PHDL, a pre-filled form will let you order the article through your department's Partner Library. There is no direct charge for your requests.

2. **In PubMed.** The PubMed button takes you to your full-text article or help you request the article from your Partner Library.


The PHDL page at <https://nphco.tdnetdiscover.com> uses the special PubMed link to help you find PHDL full-text articles.

The **Check PHDL** button appears in every citation when viewed in Abstract format.

When you find an article you want, click on the **Check PHDL** button.

If the article is in the PHDL collection you are taken to the full text article in HTML or PDF.

If the article is not in the PHDL, a pre-filled form will let you order the article through your department's Partner Library. There is no direct charge for your requests.
